



## WHAT DO I NEED TO DO?

#### ORIGINALS:


These are the original digital files from your camera or original scanned negative

### EDITS:

Save a JPEG, PNG, or TIFF file of your best from that assignment at 300 dpi. This file is the edited, corrected, cropped, adjusted version.

### FINAL FOR AP:

Change the image size to 72 resolution (ppi) and 10 inches in the largest dimension, select save as, then JPEG – for AP



When saving, make sure to change the format in the drop-down menu in


You CANNOT just type in the file extension, this




### Making Contact Sheets in Photoshop CS3

First, place all photos you want to make a contact sheet from into a folder. Then select all of them and open them in Preview (Command+A, then double click one photo). Look at the photos and make sure they are rotated the correct way, then close them.

Open Photoshop, go to File>Automate>Contact Sheet



Use Folder as your source and then click Choose. Now, select the folder where your photos are located and click Choose. Make sure the document is 8 x 10 at 150 Resolution. Click Flatten All Layers. Choose the right number of Columns and rows based on the number of photos you have (if there are more than 35 make 2 pages). Uncheck Rotate For Best Fit, and check Use Filename As Caption.




Click OK and it will generate your contact sheet. Save it, then upload it to Flickr.

### Making Contact Sheets in Photoshop CS3




### Crop if needed

- Resize if needed
- Adjust Levels (Exposure)
- Color Balance
- Dodge/Burn if necessary
- Sharpen
- Save as PSD document
- Flatten and save as JPG

## EDITING

- -Editing should strengthen the image, making it better.
- -Editing should be non-destructive (don't change the original file)
- -Editing cannot make a good photo out of a bad one, editing can't turn your cat photo into a masterpiece

# DO IT RIGHT IN THE CAMERA & SAVE TIME IN THE COMPUTER



Add Grain
Add Vignette





AVOID taking any one editing tool too far:

-losing detail in highlights/shadows when adjusting levels

- -over-saturating colors
- -over-sharpening edges
- -over-anything

# NO NO'S

Beware of making the image more about the editing and less about the actual image (cross process/selective color)
